In the Classroom

As we continue with the clothes study, the children have been busy with different activities. They have been learning about how to care for their clothes, what the numbers mean on the tags of their clothes, and designing their own clothes onto a pre-traced actual size of their bodies.

We completed an experiment with different types of laundry soap such as liquid, powder, or bar soap. The children made a guess on which one would make the most bubbles. Their guesses were written down and tested. The bar soap proved to be the product with the most bubbles.

We were very surprised!

Some children showed their creativity as they made their own Leprechaun traps using a variety of materials. They set them out but did not catch a Leprechaun.

The children were introduced to weaving and how to use a loom.


This activity helped work on patterning and was a follow up to a story that we read titled:
